Guidance for Submission of Posters

Format

You will need to provide a printed hard copy poster **and** an electronic version (either an e poster¹ or a PDF).

Visual impact

Posters should be eye-catching visual representations of the topic or subject: they can include graphics, tables, charts, concise text and/or images. Please use images and material that can be shared by [Creative Commons](#) licence or images that you have secured permission to use that meet any copyright requirements.

Display

The poster sessions will be on display throughout the conference but delegates will be invited to come and talk to presenters during the refreshment breaks. We also intend to publicise the posters on the website pre, post and during the conference.

Therefore please provide **both** a printed poster and Electronic Copy

- Print Format **A0** (84.1cm x118.9cm) if your poster is for portrait display or reduce this to **A1 size** (59.4cm x 84.1cm) if it is for landscape display. (The display panels are 2m high x 1m wide)
- Electronic Format : Please email a PDF version or provide a link to an E-Poster¹ . This will be shared online via the SALT conference website. This maximises publicity of your hard work so please ensure that you provide this by the deadline below.

Printing, delivery and set up on the Day

You are responsible for printing and delivery of your poster. Posters should be single sided. Poster hangers will be provided. The SALT Team will set up your poster as we cannot have access to the venue until the morning of the day and therefore it is essential that your poster is printed well in advance of the deadline below.

Deadlines

Please email your PDF (or link to an ePoster) by **Wed 28 June 2017** so that we can upload to the website in advance of the conference. (Email Deborah.baff@swansea.ac.uk) Your hard copy poster should be delivered for my attention *no later than 12.00 Mid-Day Monday 3 July 2017* (Debbie Baff at SALT office – at the back of the Taliesin (Former CDS Building) Room 316.)
